


Cemetery Grounds Access

All events are free of charge but they do require advance reservations by emailing **jcapuano@elmcem.org** or by calling Joan on **313/801-1971**.


Events


MESSAGE FROM TERRY P. BOOK PRESIDENT, HISTORIC ELMWOOD FOUNDATION

Elmwood Trees – Detroit's First Certified Arboretum

- Arbor Day Celebration Join our grounds crew and local school children as we plant trees in honor of Arbor Day and talk about the importance of trees to our environment, how to care for them and how they are used in producing every day products.
- Tree Tours are held in the spring and fall. Join us as we and a certified arborist talk about the history of Elmwood and some of the different species among our 1,450 trees in this walking tour. Of course trees are also discussed during our bird walks and our history tours.

Elmwood's Outdoor Sculpture Garden

Elmwood Cemetery's unique display of memorial art creates a lasting legacy, from towering obelisks to flat markers. The decorative symbolism of memorials has much to do with the period of time and indicates something of importance to the honored individual. Did you know animals represent many different things:

Bunny, butterfly, lamb, and snake – resurrection and peace

Dove – peace, resurrection, the Holy Spirit

Fish - Jesus

Geese - nature

Hawk and Eagle – war or military service

Lion – a guardian and guards against evil

Self-guided Maps and Audio Tours


- African American Heritage From the 1800s through present day, Elmwood is proud to honor many key African American leaders. It includes, among others, abolitionists, attorneys, business leaders, entertainers, religious leaders, teachers, and historians.
- Business Visionaries Many Detroit business leaders were visionary, smart, persistent, influential and passionate.
 They, along with many others, took advantage of the ability to establish and grow businesses here. This tour highlights some of the people who had a significant impact on growing Detroit into one of the most dynamic cities in the world.
- Leadership Legacies Elmwood is the final resting place of 7 governors, 11 US senators, and 30 Detroit mayors. They recognized and met the real need for civic responsibility at times when the city and country were undergoing dramatic change.

Elmwood Biographies – Elmwood has significantly expanded its information on people in the cemetery and we include photos where possible.

Arboretum Tours – Elmwood developed self-guided tree tours, dividing the 86-acres into three maps highlighting

deciduous, flowering and evergreen trees throughout the property. The actual trees have a tree identification marker with the scientific and common name as well as a QR code if you have a smart device, you can use this code to learn more about the species.

Birding Species List – Our birding list continues to grow. Please let us know if you spy additional species during your walks on our grounds.
